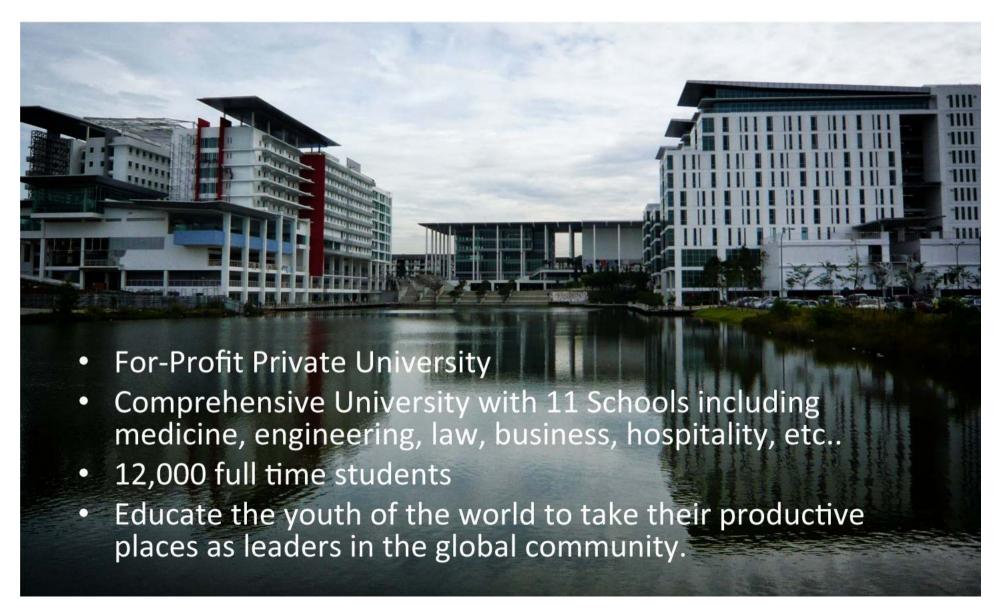

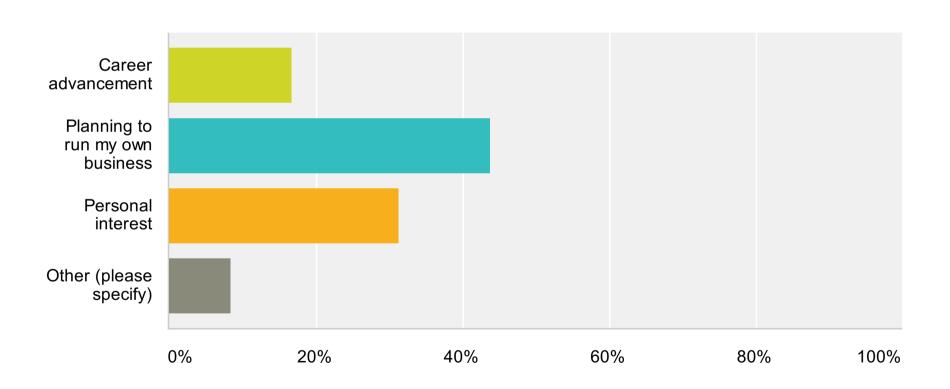

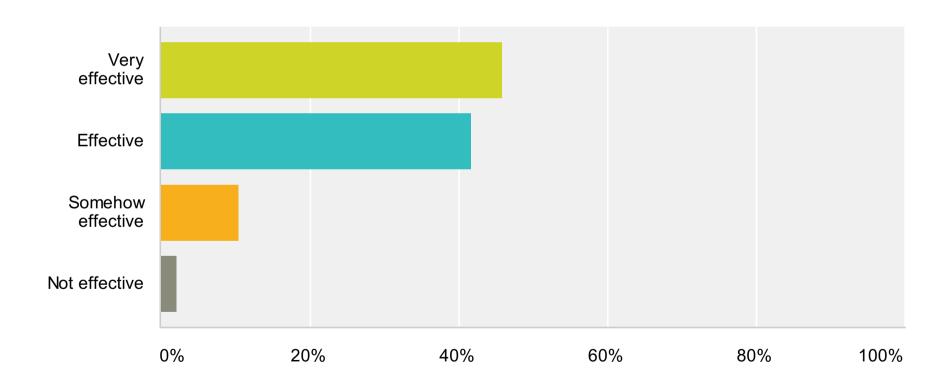
Projects

 - Upon which Taylor's University will grant a Scholarship to one deserving student selected by the rewired community.

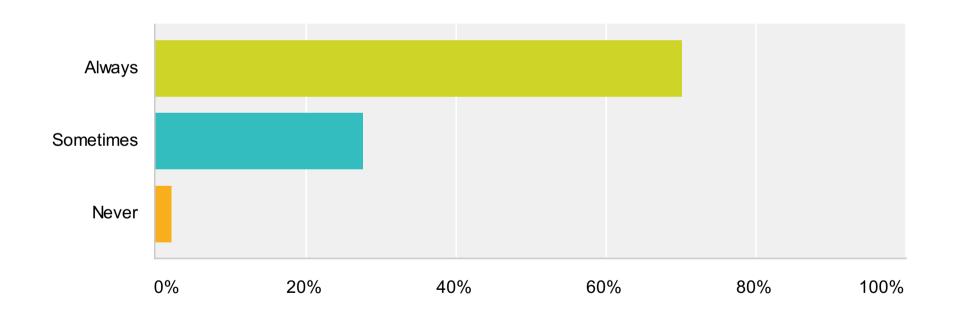
What was your reason to join this MOOC?



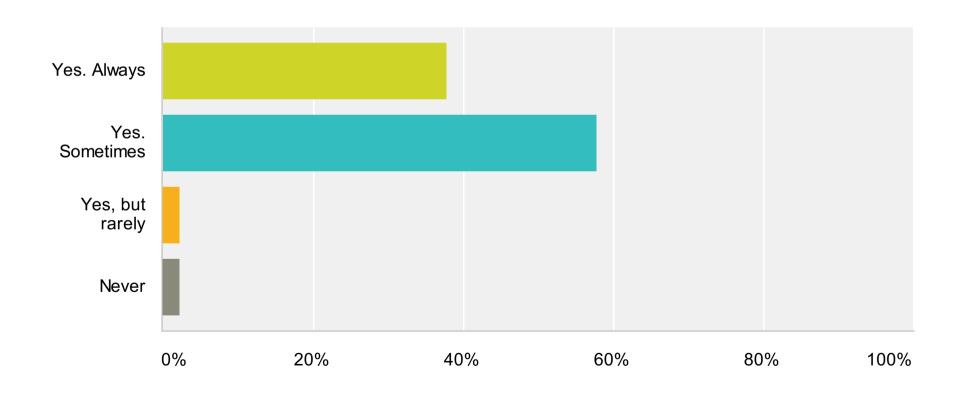
How effective your learning was?



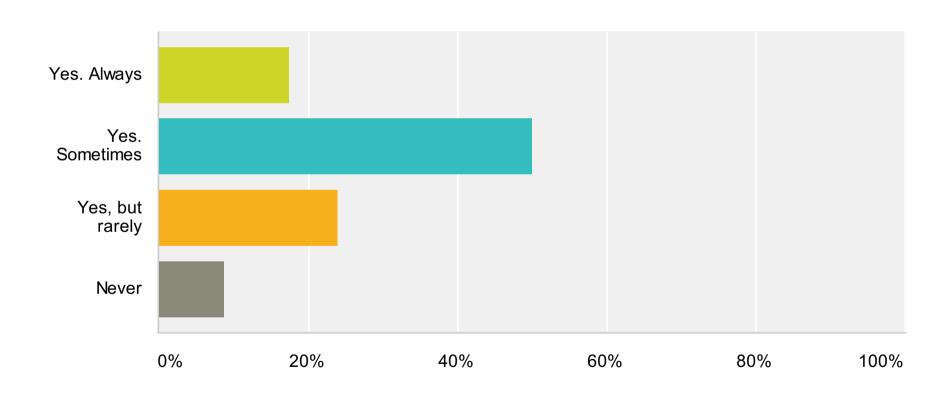
Did you receive useful feedback from the instructor?



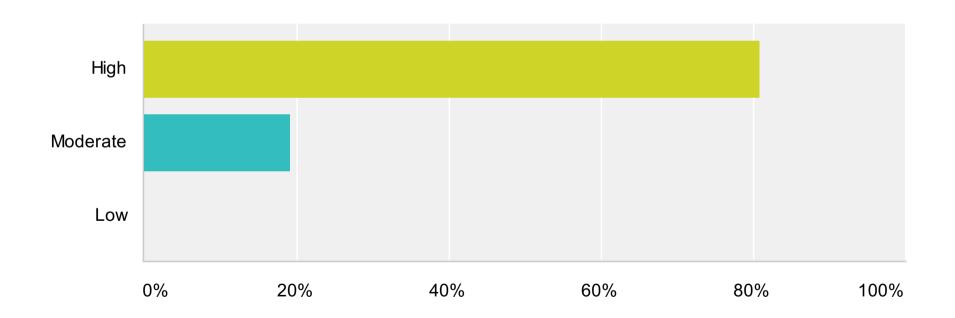
Did other students on the MOOC offer help and support?



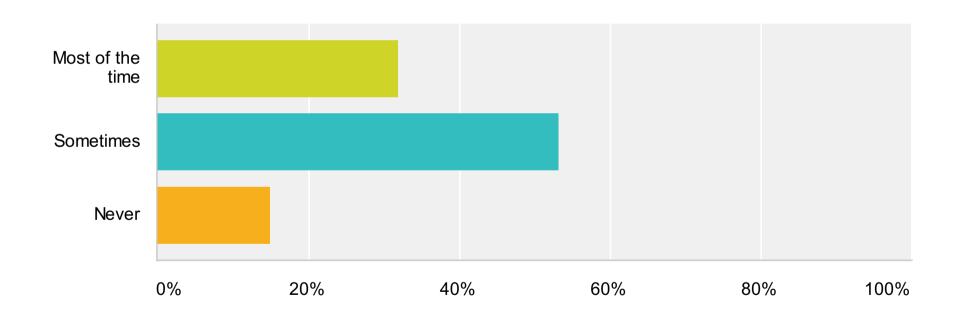
Did you provide help and support to other students on the MOOC?



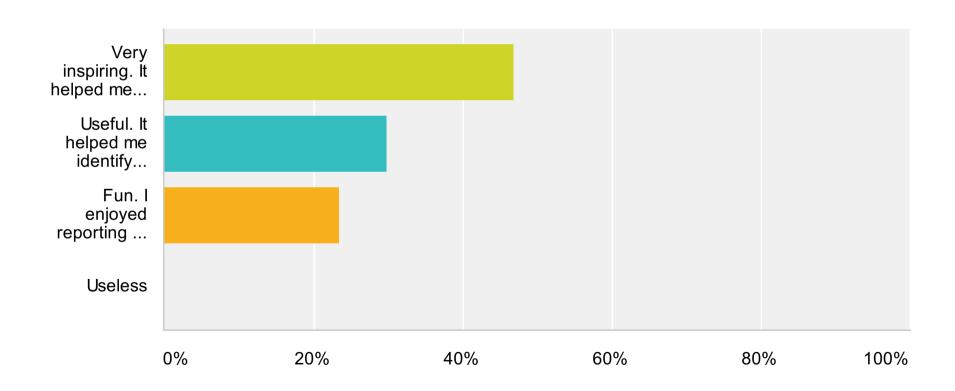
How was the quality of learning materials (lectures, quizzes, etc..)?
