To apply for a partial travel scholarship, you must meet all of the following criteria:

Respond to the official MIT LINC 2010 [“Call for papers”](#)

Submit a brief, 1-page, summary defining the most critical issue/s facing you in your efforts in one or more of the following areas:

- Innovations in educational technology to bring education to all
- New media for instruction
- New pedagogical models facilitated by technology
- The impact of MOOCS on universities worldwide
- Impediments to bringing education to all
- E-learning in emerging nations
- Open Education Resources (OER)
- The impact of technology in lowering the cost of education
- Universities and lifelong learning
- Universities and STEM education for high school students (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math)
- Web 2.0 and Social Software

AND explain how your participation in this conference might help you address your challenge/s.

The participation in the MIT LINC 2013 will assist me in the following:

1. Working with collaborative groups that interested in development of education. I have proposed a new school in Jordan and so how will this new school be?
2. Using the appropriate technology commonly used in the daily life
3. Tackling the research problem using multidisciplinary approach
4. Sharing the results with the LINC 2013 participants and receiving their feedback
5. Clearly defining the products that students will create during the challenge and how will be evaluated
6. Evaluating school and standards and assessments when determining the challenges

Entries will be reviewed on a first come, first served basis (but no later than March 31, 2013), and will be reviewed by the MIT LINC organizing committee as quickly as possible to allow ample time for each qualified scholarship recipient to make proper travel arrangements. Payment of these scholarship funds will be made to recipients after they have attended the conference and returned home.
